## **Quality Service**

Beginning with your initial contact, you'll find that our personalized service is second to none. Faculty and staff are dedicated to the principle that it is only through your success that we succeed. We are readily available to assist you with information from the application process to graduation requirements.

### **Self-Paced Programs**

Begin courses at anytime and study when it best fits your schedule. With the CSU Open Enrollment System, you can set your own pace for completing your degree program. Students are allowed 10 weeks to complete each course.

## **No Residency Required**

Forget the days of scheduled online sessions and on-site test taking! At CSU, residency is not a requirement and coursework can be completed at times that are most convenient for you. Faculty and staff offer flexible individualized instruction designed to provide each student with the guidance and support necessary for successful course completion.

## **No Group Projects**

There are no group projects and courses are totally asynchronous. Study offline anytime and anywhere that works best for you and simply log back on to submit the prepared assignments by the due date.

## **Military Discounts**

All Servicemembers receive an application fee waiver (\$25 value). Immediate family receives the waiver and a 10 percent tuition discount. Graduate-level tuition is also reduced to \$250 per credit hour for active Servicemembers. The lower tuition is offered to keep the tuition rate at the Department of Defense (DoD) cap of \$250.

## **Maximum Transfer Credit**

CSU allows maximum transfer credit for your prior academic credit, training, and relevant professional licenses and certifications. Up to 75 percent of undergraduate courses and 50 percent of graduate courses can be transferred into your degree program at CSU.

## **Textbooks at No Cost**

Textbooks are provided at no cost through the CSU Book Grant. Scholarship recipients are not eligible for this grant.

## **Complimentary Tutoring Services**

CSU offers writing and math tutoring services at no cost. Tutoring services are available from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Friday.

## **Affordable Education**

When comparing quality and cost—CSU is your best option. Our tuition is competitively priced to make achieving a quality education affordable and realistic for the average person. Federal Student Aid and military educational benefits are also available for eligible participants.

### **Accreditation and Recognition**

CSU is an accredited member of the Distance Education and Training Council (DETC). The accrediting commission of the DETC is listed by the U.S. Department of Education as a nationally recognized accrediting agency and is a recognized member of the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA). # **Transfer Credit**

CSU allows maximum transfer credit for your prior academic credits, training, and relevant professional licenses and certifications. Up to 75 percent of undergraduate courses and 50 percent of master level courses can be transferred into your degree program at CSU. Students are allowed to transfer in 15 percent of coursework into the DBA program.

### **Evaluation**

CSU will conduct a comprehensive evaluation of your transcripts. Please allow at least 7 to 10 business days for us to provide you with a detailed evaluation report. This report will outline those courses we have determined you should take and those which we have accepted for transfer credit.

## **Academic Credit**

CSU accepts academic transfer credit from institutions accredited by agencies recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education and/or the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA). For prior undergraduate academic credit to be eligible for transfer, grades earned must be a "C" or higher; however, a maximum of three courses in which a "D" was earned may be considered during the admission process. "D's" are not accepted as transfer credit for English Composition I, II, or their equivalent. For prior academic credit to be eligible for transfer at the master's degree level, grades earned must be a "B" or higher; however, a maximum of one course in which a "C" was earned may be considered during the admission process.

## Professional Licenses, Certificates and Training Programs

CSU uses guidelines established by the American Council on Education (ACE) to determine if certain training programs, certificates, professional licenses and/or military training warrant awarding academic credit.

## **Transfer Credit by Examination**

CSU accepts credit by examination from the following:

- The College Level Examination Program (CLEP)
- Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education (DANTES)

## **Transcript Request Service**

CSU will obtain transcripts on your behalf! We will contact the prior colleges and/or universities you've attended to secure all the transcripts needed to make sure you receive maximum transfer credit. Fees associated with this service include \$10 for one transcript request or \$20 for multiple transcript requests. Fees are nonrefundable. To use this service, you will need to complete the Transcript Request Service Forms available on the CSU website.

# **Military Friendly School**



### Accelerate Your Future. Earn Your Degree Online.

Recognized as one of the top schools for military education, nearly half of the students enrolled at CSU are members of the U.S. military. Completely online programs, open enrollment, flexible courses, and affordable tuition allow Servicemembers to achieve a quality education while preserving our nation's freedom.

## GoArmyEd

Few other colleges and universities have been invited to participate in the U.S. Army GoArmyEd initiative

that allows active duty soldiers to request TA online. This dynamic online portal automates many of the paper-based processes historically conducted with Army Education Counselors. If you are currently enrolled at CSU or are planning to apply, please visit GoArmyEd to set up your account and to learn more about how to take advantage of your TA benefits.

## Servicemembers Opportunity Colleges (SOC)

SOC is a consortium of more than 1,800 colleges and universities that provide educational opportunities for Servicemembers and their families. SOC is co-sponsored by the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) and the American Association of Community Colleges (AACC) in cooperation with 13 other educational associations, the Military Services, the National Guard, and the Coast Guard.

## Air University Associate-to-Baccalaureate Cooperative (AU-ABC)

CSU is one of few universities that have enrolled in the Air University Associate-to-Baccalaureate Cooperative (AU-ABC). This initiative allows Airmen to transfer at least 60 semester hours of the Community College of the Air Force (CCAF) degree into a bachelor's degree program. The accelerated program requires no more than 61 semester hours to complete a bachelor's degree with CSU and will be offered in a completely online format.

To participate in the AU-ABC program, registrants must be active duty Air Force, Air Force Reserve, or Air National Guard. However, degree requirements can be completed after a member retires or separates from the service. # **Military Educational Benefits**



CSU is approved to accept Tuition Assistance (TA), and Veterans Affairs (VA) benefits. Additional education funding is available to those approved for TA and eligible for MGIB-Active Duty benefits. In most cases, these benefits cover the entire cost of your program. You can complete seven undergraduate courses or five graduate courses annually without exceeding the DoD annual ceiling of \$4,500. The CSU military tuition rate for undergraduate and graduate courses is at or below the DoD semester hour cap of \$250.

### **Tuition Assistance/DANTES**

Tuition assistance is available to all active duty, active Guard/ Reserve, and military and civilian personnel of the Army National Guard through the Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support (DANTES). Tuition assistance will cover 100 percent of tuition costs for the majority of active duty service members. Each branch of service has established an annual cap for tuition assistance. Reserve component members are also eligible for tuition assistance under this policy. However, each service component has established specific guidelines, limits, and policies for their members that may be different than the typical active duty policy.

#### **VA Benefits**

Students using VA Benefits must enroll through the CSU Term Enrollment System. Tuition is due at the time of registration and benefits will be paid directly to the student by VA. In order for CSU to process a registration for students utilizing VA/GI Bill benefits, all required forms must be submitted to VA and CSU. This will help ensure that benefits are paid in a timely manner. Tuition and fees are payable in U.S. funds. CSU accepts checks, money orders, and credit cards.

\*The tuition rate for graduate courses per-credit hour is \$250 for all active-duty Military Servicemembers. The lower rate is offered to keep the tuition rate at the DoD cap of \$250.

## **Tuition Refund Policy**

Per-Course Enrollment System Policy Students who wish to drop/ withdraw from a course should complete the Course Drop/ Withdrawal Form located in the myCSU student portal. Alternatively, students may withdraw in any manner by contacting the CSU Student Services Department by phone, e-mail, chat or fax. Any refunds due will be issued within 30 business days. If CSU is notified of cancellation no later than the second day of the course (one day after the course start date) or within five calendar days of submitting/ signing the enrollment agreement, whichever is later, a full refund of tuition will be issued (also see CSU Book Grant policy). All students withdrawing after the second day of the course will be charged a 20 percent Registration Fee (maximum of \$200 per degree program). The remaining tuition will be refunded based on the course start date and the tuition percentage amounts as follows.

2nd week—60%	5th week—0%
3rd week—40%	

Term Enrollment System Policy Students who wish to drop/withdraw from a course should complete the Course Drop/Withdrawal Form located in the myCSU student portal. Alternatively, students may withdraw in any manner by contacting the CSU Student Services Department by phone, email, chat or fax. Any refunds due will be issued within 30 business days. Tuition refund for course withdrawals are based on the Term Enrollment Tuition Refund Policy. All students that drop/withdraw from a course after the drop date will be charged a one-time 20 percent Registration Fee (maximum of \$200 per degree program). The remaining tuition will be refunded based on the term start date and the tuition percentage amounts listed below.

## **Book Grant**

New or used textbooks are provided at no cost through the CSU Book Grant as long as the student successfully completes the course. When a student drops, withdraws, or fails a course, a charge for the textbook and shipping will be posted to the student's account. The student may return the text within 30 days to have the charge reversed. Alternatively, the student may re-enroll in the same course and indicate on the Course Retake Form that the previously provided text will be used. As long as the Enrollment Agreement is submitted within 30 days of the drop/withdrawal or failure, the text charge will be reversed. The charge will be based on the textbook price listed at the CSU website and \$12 for shipping and handling. Upon submission of the Drop/Withdrawal

Form at the myCSU student portal, a Textbook Return Form will be provided for printing and enclosing with the returned text. Students who return textbooks without proper paperwork to identify themselves will not receive credit for the return. Students who do not return text and do not pay the text charge may not be allowed to enroll in future courses.

## **Payment Options**

Several different payment options are available including Per-Course Enrollment full payment, Per-Course Enrollment split payment plan, Term Enrollment full paymeny, Term Enrollment split payment, military educational benefits, corporate direct billing or Federal Financial Aid.

## **Federal Financial Aid**

Federal Financial Aid offers grant and loan programs administered by the U.S. Department of Education.

## **VA Flex Payment Plan**

VA students may place a \$99 down payment for the first or second enrollment. Tuition must be paid in full prior to the third enrollment. This VA Flex Payment Plan is not available for Federal Student Aid, Tuition Assistance, Chapter 31, Chapter 33 or if you are receiving any other form of financial assistance.

### **The Admission Process**

Complete the application for admission located in the back of this catalog, or submit your application online by visiting www.ColumbiaSouthern.edu/ Apply-Now. Please submit your academic transcripts by mail, fax or email after sending your application. Official transcripts are required for full acceptance.

CSU will conduct a comprehensive evaluation of your transcript and provide you with a detailed evaluation report. This report will outline courses you need to complete, transfer credit accepted, and any additional information.

Contact the admissions department or visit our website (www.ColumbiaSouthern. edu) to enroll. Our open enrollment system allows you to begin your program at anytime. We will walk you through the process of enrolling for your first course.

## **Admission Requirements**

## Requirements for admission into our degree programs include:

#### Undergraduate Programs

*High School Students*—An accredited official high school transcript (showing completion) or GED.

*Veterans/Military Servicemembers*—In lieu of a high school transcript or GED, veterans/ military men and women may submit form DD-214 or a Military Statement of Service indicating high school graduation.

*Transfer Students*—Transfer students who have completed an associate degree may provide CSU with the official institutional transcript showing conferred degree. *Home School Students*—A detailed guide for meeting CSU admissions requirements may be viewed at www.ColumbiaSouthern.edu/Future-Students/HomeSchool/.

Master's Degree Programs—An accredited bachelor's degree.

**Doctoral Program**—An accredited bachelor's degree and Master of Business Administration with two years of professional experience post baccalaureate. Candidates must submit a resume.

### **International Students**

Applicants whose native language is not English and who have not earned a degree from an appropriately accredited institution where English is the principal language of instruction are required to submit one of the following official test score reports prior to admission:

- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) test score with the following: Undergraduate—A minimum of 500 in the paper-based version or 61 in the Internet-based version.
  Master's—A minimum of 530 in the paper-based version or 71 in the Internet-based version.
  Doctorate—A minimum of 550 in the paper-based version or 80 in the Internet-based version.
- A minimum grade of Level 3 on the ACT COMPASS English as a Second Language Placement Test
- A minimum score of 6.0 on the International English Language Testing System (IELTS), including the academic writing and academic reading modules
- A minimum grade of Pre-1 on the Eiken English Proficiency Exam

### **Computer Access**

CSU students must have access to the Internet and an appropriate individual (non-shared) e-mail account in order to complete a program of study at CSU. If personal Internet service is unavailable, you are encouraged to contact local libraries, schools or a public business to locate access to the Internet. Microsoft Word and Adobe Reader are also required. Other Microsoft Office products may be required for Information Technology courses such as ITC 3001.

# **Getting Started**

Fitting an education into your already busy schedule is not easily done, but it is possible. Our completely online programs are designed with the flexibility you need to fit your education around career and family commitments. You can begin at anytime and study at a pace that best fits your lifestyle.

### Enrollment

CSU offers two convenient enrollment systems:

#### Per-Course/Open Enrollment (10 Week Courses)

The CSU Per-Course Enrollment System allows students to begin a course at any time. There are no predetermined semester or session dates. Students may take one course after another or multiple courses simultaneously.

#### Term Enrollment (8 Week Courses)

Students using Federal Financial Aid or VA Benefits must use the Term Enrollment System. Courses must be completed within eight weeks, have set start and end dates, and are cohort based. All students in the course will start the course together and proceed through the course on the same timeline.

Students must submit discussion board postings and other assignments by the weekly due date. You can enroll in one or multiple courses during each eight week term.

## **Temporary Status**

Even if we are still missing copies of the transcripts we need to complete your evaluation, you can enroll immediately under "Temporary" Admissions Status. As a "Temporary" student, you may complete up to 12 undergraduate semester hours or seven graduate semester hours. Once all official transcripts are received and evaluated, an Application Evaluation Report will be issued and your status will be changed.






## Hero Behind the Hero Scholarship

CSU recognizes the sacrifices made by the family members of America's military men and women, firefighters and law enforcement officers. In appreciation of their support, five scholarships will be awarded to the spouses or dependents of active duty military men and women and five will be awarded to the spouses or dependents of active firefighters or law enforcement officers. The scholarship covers tuition for up to 24 months or 75 credit hours, whichever comes first. Textbooks are not included.

## **Robert G. Mayes Memorial Scholarship**

The Robert G. Mayes Memorial Scholarship has been established in loving memory of Dr. Robert Mayes, CSU founder and president from 1993 to 2005. This \$5,000 alumni scholarship is awarded annually to a CSU alumnus who is seeking to further their education by obtaining a masters or DBA degree from CSU. ## **Certificate Transfer Option**

Students who complete an undergraduate/graduate certificate program through CSU may transfer those courses into a degree program with the corresponding concentration. The fee for processing this transfer and certificate is \$150. To request this transfer, the certificate has to be petitioned for prior to completing the degree, unless petitioning for a different certificate in a separate concentration so as not to diminish the degree. No transfer credit is accepted into certificate programs. All courses must be completed as required by the certificate.
