* Transfer Credit/General Notes:

- Direct transfer credit for a Major Requirement or General Concentration course requires the transfer course to be a minimum of 3 semester hours. In addition, credit is only transferred in multiples of 3 semester hours to those categories.
- Any CC course worth 4 or more semester hours but only given 3 semester hours for chart purposes would be reviewed for the full credit designated by CC, subject to program director approval.
- Credit awarded is subject to degree requirements at the time of enrollment.
- Actual number of transfer credit hours awarded (and therefore the number of hours to be completed at CSU) will be based on actual courses completed successfully at Conestoga for which there exists a CSU equivalent and could be more or less than the number of transfer credits in the example above. Please note, CSU accepts a maximum of 18 semester hours of transfer credit in the master's degree program.
